

## 2-in-1 Wireless CarPlay & Android Auto Adapter



## **How to use CarPlay**

- Start the vehicle and let the infotainment system boot completely. Turn on WiFi and Bluetooth on your iPhone.
  - Plug the adapter into the USB/USB C port that normally handles wired CarPlay.
  - Watch for the LED – a steady light means it is ready.
  - Open your iPhone's Bluetooth list and select "AutoLink xxxx." If the first attempt fails, try again.
  - After Bluetooth pairing, your iPhone will automatically join the adapter's WiFi network of the same name.
  - When the head unit switches to the CarPlay interface, setup is complete.
  - Future drives: the adapter will auto reconnect as long as your iPhone's WiFi & Bluetooth stay enabled.
  - Bluetooth is used only for the initial handshake; all data then moves over WiFi.
  - Because the adapter occupies your phone's WiFi, manually switching to another network will drop the CarPlay session.
  - If audio lags or cuts out, make sure the phone is not simultaneously connected to the car's built-in Bluetooth for calls/music.
- Tip: To switch to a different iPhone, disconnect Wi Fi and Bluetooth on the currently paired phone, then repeat the steps above on the new device.

For automatic reconnection, ensure:

- iOS Settings › Wi-Fi › AutoLink-xxxx › Auto-Join → ON
- In some vehicles, enable automatic connection inside the CarPlay settings menu.

## **Android Auto – How to Use**

- Before you start: Enable Wireless Android Auto on your phone: Settings › Android Auto › Developer Settings › Wireless Android Auto(Requires Android 11 or later.)
- Boot the car, turn on cellular data, WiFi and Bluetooth on your phone, and make sure it's not connected to other devices.
- Plug the adapter into the USB/USB-C port used for wired Android Auto.
- When the LED turns steady, open Bluetooth on your phone and pair with "AutoLink-xxxx."
- The phone will then auto connect to the adapter's WiFi. Wait for the Android Auto screen to appear.
- On later trips the adapter will reconnect automatically (WiFi & Bluetooth must be left ON).

If Android Auto fails to launch:

- Unplug and reinsert the adapter, then reconnect Bluetooth.

- Make sure no other device is using the adapter's WiFi.
- Clear previous pairing records on the phone and try again.
- The adapter monopolises your phone's WiFi once connected; switching networks will break the link.
- If the phone pairs to another Bluetooth device (e.g., the car's built-in system) audio input/output may stop. Disconnect the extra Bluetooth connection to restore sound.
- Enable Settings › Android Auto › General › Start Android Auto Automatically → Always for quicker launches.

## **Important Instructions**

- Compatibility only with factory wired systems – Your vehicle must already support wired Apple CarPlay or Android Auto; the adapter cannot add these features to cars that lack them.
- Phone requirements: iPhone 6 or newer running iOS 10+, Android 11+ smartphones for Android Auto
- One phone at a time – The adapter pairs with multiple phones but keeps only one active connection. Make sure other nearby phones are disconnected from the adapter's WiFi/Bluetooth signal before pairing your own.
- Avoid wireless interference – Switch off or disconnect other in car WiFi gadgets (dashcams, 360 camera kits, hotspots, etc.) if the display goes blank after pairing.
- Indicator light – Confirm that the adapter's power LED is ON before starting a new connection.

## **Online Firmware Upgrade**

- Power the adapter and connect to its WiFi (password 12345678)
- On your phone, open a browser and visit 192.168.1.101.
- Scroll to System version information, pick the newest release from the drop down list, and tap Update.
- After the update, restart your phone before using the adapter again.

Upgrade only if you experience issues that the solutions do not fix.
